### Reid Goldstein to Address AFCA Meeting

School Board Chair Reid Goldstein is the guest speaker at the AFCA monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, at 7 pm in the Barrett School Library. He will discuss issues facing Arlington Public Schools and answer questions. This is your opportunity to hear from, and provide input to, the School Board's Chair.

Mr. Goldstein was elected in 2016 and his current term expires at the end of this year. A 30-year Arlington resident, his professional career focuses on strategic planning for federal government and private industry clients. Prior to election to the School Board, he served on numerous APS, County, and neighborhood committees. His two children graduated from Arlington schools (W-L and HB Woodlawn). He is currently the School Board liaison to AFCA, Kenmore Middle School and Wakefield High School.

Looking ahead, the April 24<sup>th</sup> meeting will include a Lubber Run Farmers Market update and a vote by AFCA members on the concept design for the Edison Park renovation (see the article below for more information). May 15<sup>th</sup> is the AFCA picnic and annual membership meeting in the park shelter located upstream from the Lubber Run Amphitheater.

Other upcoming Arlington Forest events are highlighted in the Community Calendar on page 7 of this newsletter include: Neighborhood Spring Cleanup - April 27<sup>th</sup>, reopening of the Lubber Run Farmers Market - April 27<sup>th</sup>, and Annual Yard Sale - May 18<sup>th</sup>.

### **Edison Park Update**

About 16 neighbors attended the Edison Park Design Working Group on February 13<sup>th</sup>. Landscape Architect Kathy Von Bredow presented the design, which includes play areas for ages 2-5 and 5-12, basket swings, street side safety-gated fencing and native plants, accessible surfaces and tables, and more. Upgraded storm water management and a forested Resource Protection Area (RPA) will help conserve soil and stream quality.

Neighbors preferred a modern-style bridge and tunnel design for ages 2-5 and a spiral net climber for ages 5-12, on the recommendation of our youngest attendees. Concerns focused on grassy space for ball or tag. With options constrained by the park's quarter-acre size, underground sewers, RPA requirements, and the project scope AFCA approved in April 2017 (vote 24-1), no viable alternatives emerged. However, Architect Von Bredow has identified a potential strip adjacent to the RPA. See the latest and comment online at the County's project page: Edison Park Project. Thanks to the Neighborhood Conservation Program (NCP), Arlington County Parks and Recreation, and participating neighbors for progress on this project. Next steps?

1. AFCA will vote on the design at our April 24<sup>th</sup> AFCA meeting.

2. Once approved, the project moves into the construction phase. Geotechnical work done then may uncover issues that could affect the final design.

# **Upcoming Events**

**Spring Cleanup:** Mark your calendar for the morning of Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> for AFCA's eighth annual Arlington Forest Spring Cleanup. We will pick up trash, remove invasive plants, and otherwise beautify our public spaces. Cleanup sites will be the Lubber Run streambed, the Arlington Blvd southside buffer strip, and the Four Mile Run streambed at the foot of N. Greenbrier Street. More details will appear in next month's newsletter.

**Arlington Forest Yard Sale:** Arlington Forest's long-running annual Community Yard Sale is around the corner. This year's event will be on Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>. With around 40 Arlington Forest households participating each year, the event attracts bargain hunters from around the Metro area who are drawn to the convenience of cruising though one area to visit many sales. **Block Party Season:** Spring is the perfect season for block parties. If your block is not among the many in Arlington Forest that hold annual block parties, you might consider organizing one. Block parties are a great way to bring together neighbors. Kids have a blast playing in the closed-off street while adults enjoy a pot-luck dinner and good conversation. To organize a block party, first talk up the idea with a few neighbors and set a date and time. Then create a simple printed flyer and deliver it door-to-door inviting everyone on the block and informing them of the temporary street closure. You will need a right-of-way permit which includes delivery of six safety cones (recoup the \$69 fee by putting out a donation jar during the party). Union Army reenactors from the 3<sup>rd</sup> United States Regulars and 54<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts have come to Arlington and set up camp at Fort C.F. Smith Park at 2411 24<sup>th</sup> St N, Arlington 22207. This day of living history will include drilling, activities, specialized fort tours and more. Learn about Civil War life in Arlington County and beyond at this free event.

**Ball-Sellers House Opening Day:** April 6<sup>th</sup>, 1-4 pm. 5620 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, S. in the Glencarlyn neighborhood. The oldest house in Arlington, built c. 1742, opens for the season with reenactors, a special event, free docent-led house tours, and colonial era snacks.

#### How's the market?

Compared to the previous December, contract activity in Arlington was up 20% in December 2018. The Amazon announcement created a perfect storm – it fueled demand precisely at a time when inventory is seasonally low. In December 2018, inventory was about 40% lower than it was in September 2018 in Arlington. As expected, inventory was already headed down before the Amazon announcement, so when contract activity increased in the last six weeks of the year in Arlington there was already less inventory to fight over. Since we were then in a time of year where few listings come on the market, buyers were grabbing whatever was there.

And that squeeze resulted in absorption rates rarely seen. In Arlington, there were only 9 townhomes on the market at the end of December and there were 28 that went under contract – the absorption rate for townhomes priced under \$1,000,000 was 100%. Detached homes and condos under \$1,000,000 had absorption rates north of 70%! Predictions are that these meteoric rates will not to continue to rise.

So far in January and early February the inventory level of homes is lower than past years. Lower to medium priced homes up to \$800,000 are attracting multiple offers since there are more buyers in those price ranges. Over the last three months, prices are up, and competition is fierce in Arlington and the close in surrounding Northern Virginia communities. Homes in turn-key condition get the most attention and sell quickly. In reality, all homes will sell when priced properly for their location, size and condition. In early February we are seeing a few more new listings hit the market which is a good sign for buyers. With prices rising, right now is a great time to buy with mortgage rates below 4.5% for a 30-yr fixed mortgage but could start going up again anytime.

**English Ivy is Destructive:** Winter is a great time to identify and remove evergreen English Ivy. If left unattended this invasive plant can weigh down trees to the point of collapse. If allowed to cover fences, ivy can invade adjacent lawns and public parkland. But you can easily remove ivy by cutting all vines at the ground level. # **Barrett School News**

Parking Notes: A Thank You and Reminder from Barrett Elementary's principal, Mr. Dan Redding:

All of us at Barrett Elementary School would like to thank the members of the Arlington Forest Citizens Association for your continued support of Barrett and patience with parking around the school. As you may remember, Barrett is experiencing a shortage of parking spaces this year due to the construction that is underway at the Lubber Run Community Center, which used to provide overflow parking for approximately 35 Barrett teachers and staff as well as visitors.

The Barrett school parking lot provides approximately 75 parking spaces for 110 staff, leaving the remainder without access to parking spaces while Lubber Run Community Center is unavailable. When confronted with this challenge at the last school year, APS Facilities announced a plan to use a portion of the school blacktop for temporary parking. The community raised concerns about the loss of play space and asked us to find other solutions.

Fortunately, the Arlington Forest Citizens Association generously offered to spread the word to neighbors that our teachers will be parking on the street in spaces with no time limit restrictions. We would like to thank the Association and neighboring residents for helping to spread the word and encourage patience. While we recognize that it has been an added strain for community parking, this has been extremely helpful, and the Barrett teachers and staff are grateful. While some teachers carpool or use public transit options, many teachers commute long distances to the school, so access to nearby parking makes a difference.
