## Lubber Run Amphitheater 2017 Season By Chris Scheer

"Wolf Trap Arlington?" This summer's schedule of free arts entertainment at the Lubber Run Amphitheater (LRA) certainly lives up to that billing.

From June to September the amphitheater located in the heart of Arlington Forest will present 30 programs covering the gamut of the lively arts: theater and dance, rock, hip hop, classical music, country and folk, world music, jazz/R&B and entertainment for kids (see the full schedule in this issue on pages 8-9).

The Lubber Run Amphitheater is brought to you by Arlington Arts, a Division of Arlington Economic Development in collaboration with Arlington County Department of Parks and Recreation and the participation of the non-profit Lubber Run Amphitheater Foundation. The Foundation is a community organization formed eight years ago to bring LRA back when the County closed it due to deterioration and safety concerns. Now, the Foundation sponsors in whole or in part several performances every season. This year for the first time, the Foundation is paying half the cost for a regular season performance -- the hit musical "The Gospel At Colonus" -- by WSC Avant Bard, described by critics as "a soaring celebration of transcendence."

The Foundation is also funding four kids' programs: ....continued on page 2



## Community Yard Sale - May 20

The map on the back cover of this newsletter depicts the 30 participants who signed up for Arlington Forest Community Yard Sale before this issue's editing deadline. Sellers are encouraged to make photocopies of the map (also downloadable from the online Arlington Forester at www. arlingtonforestva.org under the Newsletter tab) and display them alongside their merchandise so that, once shoppers find one sale site, they can pick up a map leading them to other sites.

In past years, additional sellers have participated without submitting their address to be marked on the map. So, as you walk around your neighborhood on yard sale morning, you may find additional sellers.

Suggestions on how to run a successful sale include: display items in shopper-friendly ways, sort clothes by size and toys by user age, have grocery sacks on hand, price items reasonably, accept only cash, be ready to make change, and watch your money. To snag buyers who make yard sales their business, start setting up at 7 am. In late morning, people come out looking for close-out prices. If left with large items that you simply want to get rid of, leave them at the curb with a "free" sign and they will probably be gone by Sunday afternoon.

Sale participants living near Arlington Blvd, Carlin Springs Rd., George Mason Dr. and Henderson Dr. are encouraged

to post signs pointing into the neighborhood and to their sales (please remove signs at day's end). AFCA will also post signs at strategic points.

In addition, AFCA has placed classified ads in the Washington Post and the Sun Gazette and online ads on Craigslist, the Arlington Patch, and YardSaleSearch.com. The ads mention the May 21 rain date.

For many people, yard sale success is not measured by profit, but by how much unwanted stuff is moved out instead of left cluttering rooms, basement or attic. The sale is also a great community event. Families can say hello to neighbors down the block and strike their own bargains. Kids can set up a lemonade stand.

So, whether you are a seller, buyer or both, please come out on Saturday morning, May 20. The yard sale will proceed if there is drizzle or passing light showers. But if substantial rain is forecast, AFCA will send a message on its listserv if it must be shifted to the rain date May 21.

#### **Arlington Market Update**

Arlington got the biggest increase in inventory for the year this first week in May with 95 new listings. Buyers quickly ratified 90 contracts this week, many of those transactions with multiple offers. The DOM (days on market) dropped significantly to just 22 days, the lowest this year. 4 homes in Arlington Forest listed this year have sold with an average of 6 DOM.

In a hot market, planning is the most important thing buyers can do to position themselves to get a contract on the home they want (see last month's article on making a winning offer). Desirable properties move fast in Arlington, so if you're in the market you need to prepare to act fast when the right home hits the market. For sellers, they can always optimize their price with small, yet meaningful improvements. AS-IS sales are also an option and pricing right is important to draw in the right buyer. If you're considering the sale of your home and/or a home purchase, and would like to discuss the best ways to prepare, feel free to reach out to set-up a meeting with me.

**Area for March:** \*\*March 2017's median sales price of \$420,00 (all styles – condo. TH, & SFD) was up 5.3% or \$21,000 compared to last year. This is the highest March median sales price on record, with data going back to 1997. \*\*Sales volume across the DC Metro area was nearly \$2.3 billion, up 26.7% from last March. \*\*Closed sales of 4,450 were up 18.5% compared to last year. It was also the highest March level in a decade, exceeding the 3,755 sales recorded last March. \*\*New contract activity of 6,254 also reached a ten-year March high, increasing by 1.4% over last year. \*\*New listings of 8,210 were down 1.7% compared to last year. \*\*Active listings of 8,648 are down 11.5% compared to last year but up 15.3% compared to February. This is the eleventh consecutive month of declines in yearover-year inventory levels, and inventories are at the lowest March level since 2014. \*\*The average percent of original list price to sales price was 97.9%, up from last year's 97.1%, also up from February's 97.4%. \*\*The median DOM for March 2017 was 15 days, 12 days lower than 3/16


AFCA Approves Edison Park Renewal Concept Plan: At the April 19th AFCA meeting, members voted to approve the Edison Park Concept Plan presented by County landscape architect Shannon Early. The plan, which grew from the consensus reached by participants in the March 8th Edison Park Scoping meeting, will feature these elements: swings; small-sized tot lot; small-sized play area for school-aged children with priority to climbing features, new site furnishings (e.g., benches, trash bins, sign); ADA compliance (accessibility); new fence along N. Edison St.; and storm water management. Estimated cost is just over \$800,000. AFCA's approval means our project will be considered at the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Council (NCAC) December 2017 Funding Round. Then, once the County Board confirms funding, a series of meetings with our landscape architect will allow neighbors to weigh in on specific design elements and then vote on a final design. Thanks to all who participated in the scoping and approval meetings. You have helped to sustain the social, recreational, and nature appreciation opportunities that our community so values. LRCC Work Session: The final community work session for the design of the new Lubber Run Community Center in Wednesday, May 17 from 6:30 pm to 9 pm at Barrett Elementary School. VMDO, Inc. architects will present one building and park design for community feedback. They will also share the findings from the tree survey, the traffic and parking studies and explain how they are factored into the design. For more info, search "Lubber Run Project" on the County website. Come to the AFCA picnic at 5:30 pm and attend the LRCC work session on a full stomach.

Southside Volunteer Needed: Voting will be held at the association's May 17 meeting to elect AFCA officers for 2017-18. While any resident can run for any position, we know that the Southside Vice President position will need a new volunteer. Southside residents who want to ensure that their neighbors' views are represented at AFCA meetings should attend the May meeting to run for the position. Other than receiving Southside residents' AFCA dues in the fall, the duties of the position are minimal.

## Successful Neighborhood Cleanup By John Naland

We had a good turnout for the seventh annual Arlington Forest Spring Cleanup despite the intermittent drizzle on Saturday morning, April 22 (see accompanying photos).

In Lubber Run Park, the stream was cleaned by ten youths and parents from Cub Scout Pack 548 and siblings joined by four youths and parents from Brownie Troop 60010. Also helping were a few residents.

Along the buffer strip on the southside of Arlington Blvd., volunteers gathered a huge pile of brush and filled numerous sacks with trash. These neighbors have been doing annual cleanups of this area for many years.

At the foot of N. Granada St., a dozen volunteers scoured the Four Mile Run flood plain between N. Carlin Springs Dr. and Arlington Blvd filling 12 large bags with trash. The police officer shown in the photo was there to retrieve a stack of credit cards, driver's licenses, military IDs, and a 1,000 Yen note found in the bushes during the cleanup. These neighbors also do a fall cleanup of the area every year and have done their semiannual cleanups since 2008.

AFCA thanks all the volunteers for their efforts to preserve our green spaces and remove trash that otherwise would have been washed down to the Potomac River and eventually into Chesapeake Bay. After the event, the Arlington County park maintenance supervisor e-mailed me saying "Please extend our big thank you to your neighbors for all the hard work they did on Saturday under the rain to keep our County free of trash."

If you missed this year's cleanup, please join us next year -- especially if you frequently walk, jog, or bike in our local parks. Please note that you can protect our shared environment any day by picking up trash that you see along your street or in our neighborhood parks. That will keep the next rainstorm from carrying the debris into our streams and rivers.






